

NEW SHED FOR YOUNG ADULTS

A TEAM of volunteers from Edventure Frome's twelfth start-up course are aiming to set up a young adults' shed, a weekly workspace for individuals aged 18-35 to socialise whilst working on practical projects.

Rosie Simcox, one of the volunteers said, "The shed will offer a weekly workspace where people can work on practical projects individually or with others, for themselves or the community. Inspired by the Men's shed, we imagine a welcoming, creative space for people with any level of creative experience.

"We have a few questions we would like to ask the public, to help us create a shed which meets the needs of the community in Frome."
